

BUNTING - 10550
NEWBORN 0 - 9 M

Fabulous bunting with a hood and wrap closure.
Simple and practical. Adorable and comfortable...

CREATE THE LOOK

Very versatile bunting in a simple look. This is perfect for a light outerwear for the baby. Easy to put on and take off with a practical "growing ribbing" at sleeves and legs and a good warm hood. Try the different style variation suggestions for making cute baby jackets, sweaters or warm sleep sacks...
On the back of the pattern sheet you will find sketches and directions to use in designing your own outerwear.

RECOMMENDED FABRIC

The pattern is designed for medium weight knit fabric. It can be made in woven fabric, too, but it will create a different kind of comfort...

MATERIALS NEEDED

Fabric - 140 cm wide x 65 / 70 / 75 / 80 cm long

Ribbing - min. 45 cm wide x 35 cm for all sizes

Edge ribbon (bias tape or ribbon) - for the front edge and hood

Ties - can be the same as the edge ribbon

Stay tape - for stabilizing the shoulder seams

Always remember to **prewash** your fabric!

PATTERN PIECES

Garment fabric

1. FRONT ✂ X 2

2. BACK ✂ X 1

3. HOOD ✂ X 2

Ribbing

3. SLEEVE CUFF ✂ X 2

4. LEG CUFF ✂ X 2

SEAM ALLOWANCES

Seams - add 1 cm

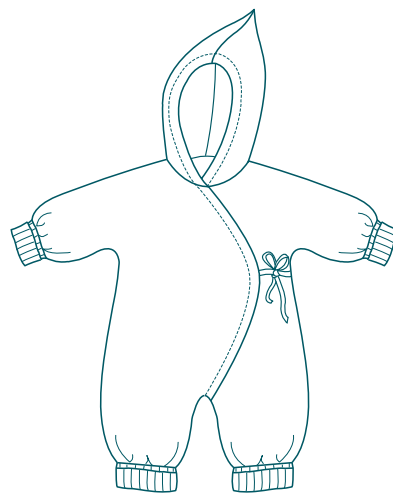
TRACE THE PATTERN

Fold out the pattern sheet. Find the EASY side of the sheet and choose the right size. Place tracing paper on top of the pattern sheet and trace. Then add seam allowances to the traced pattern pieces. Cut out the pattern pieces.
The pattern is ready to be placed on the fabric.

CUTTING THE FABRIC

Fold the fabric along the grain line. Place pattern pieces on the fabric, making sure to match the markings for grain line with the fabric grain line. Pin the pattern pieces to the fabric, to make sure they don't shift around.

NB! Be extra careful when placing the pattern pieces on fabric with nap or pile such as corduroy or velour. For the richest colour, place the pattern pieces with the nap turning upwards. Cut out the fabric.



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SEWING THE BUNTING

Remember, if you are using a knit fabric, sew using an elastic stitch.

1. Overlock or zigzag the raw edges of all the pieces.
Sew the sleeve/shoulder seams, right sides together - remember to have the stay tape in the seam.
Pin the ties in place according to markings.
Sew the sleeve/side seams, right sides together.
2. Sew the hood pieces together, right sides together.
Sew the hood to the neckline, right sides together.
Pin the edge ribbon along the front edge, right sides together and sew in place. Fold the edge ribbon to the wrong side and stitch along the side.
Sew the inseam, right sides together.
Sew the crotch area twice to give it more strength.
3. Sew each cuff side seam, right sides together.
Fold the ribbing pieces in the fold line, wrong sides together. Pin the cuffs in place on sleeve and leg hems, right sides together. Sew the ribbing cuff in place using a stretchy seam - stretching the ribbing as you sew.

TIP STAY TAPE

Stay tape is a narrow interfacing tape that is sewn to the shoulder seam to keep the shoulder seam from growing when the garment is worn.

IDEA CONTRASTING LINING

The bunting will be super cute if you line it with a contrasting lining fabric.
You can even just line the hood for the same effect.

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
